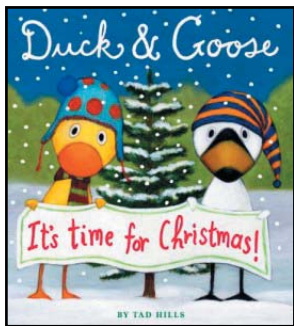
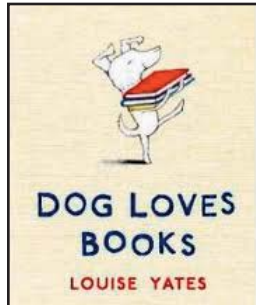

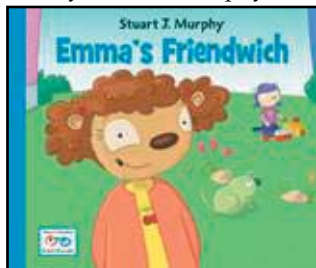
Dog Loves Books, by Louise Yates. 978-0375864490, \$16.99. A charming story about a dog who lives his dream and shares his love of books.



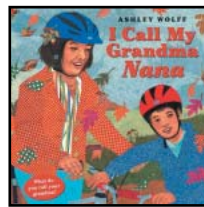
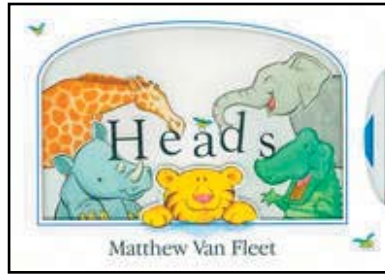

Zooborns!: Zoo Babies From Around the World, by Andrew Bleiman & Chris Eastland. 978-1442412729, \$12.99.

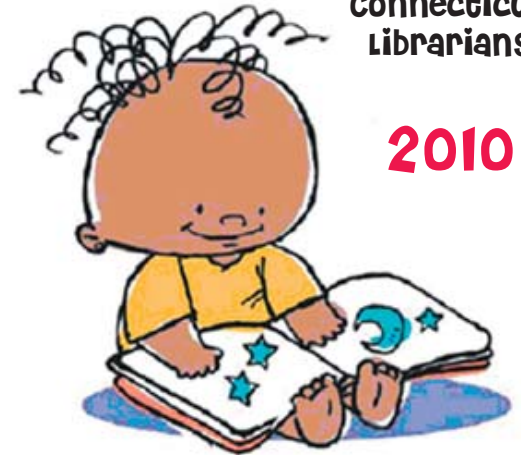
