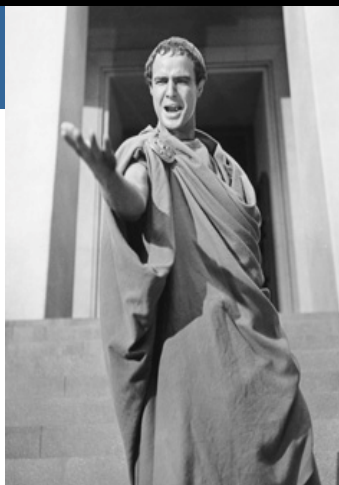

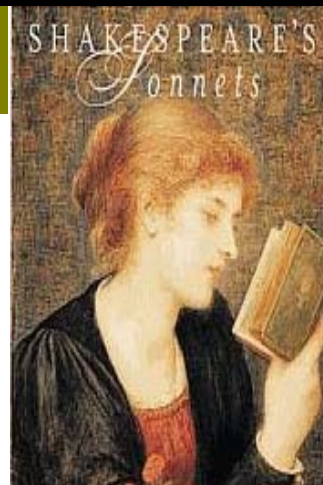
Poetry Discussion

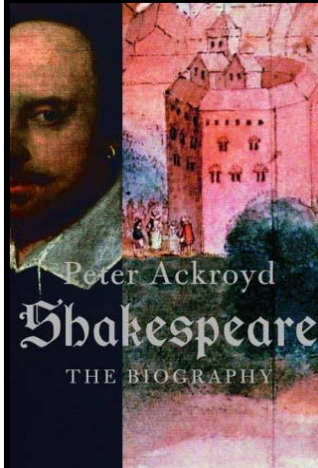
Book Discussion

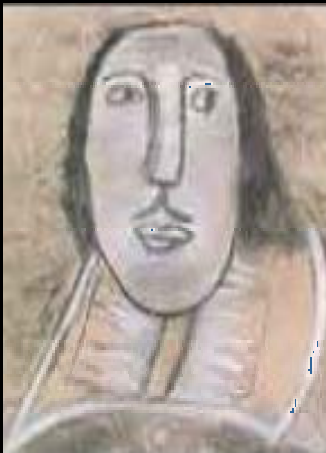

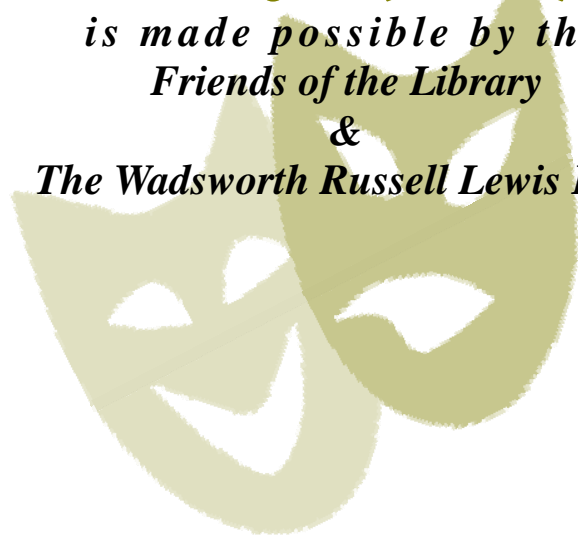
