### The Economic Crisis: Strategies for Successful College Planning

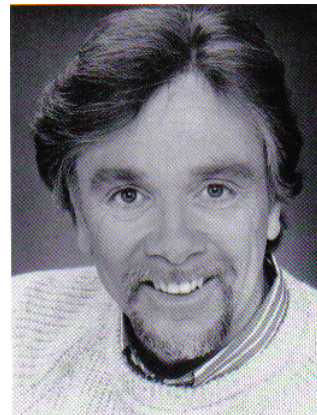

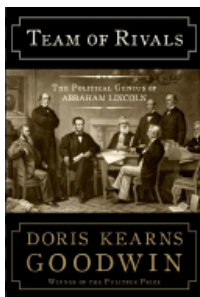

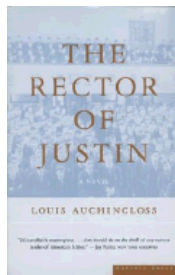


## CRITICS' CIRCLE BOOK GROUP

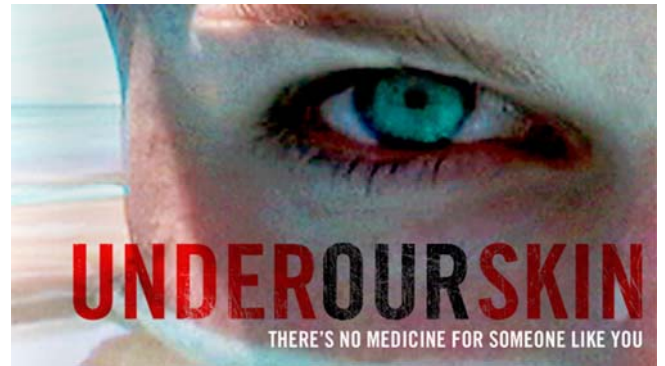

# ARTalk

Conversation with Aldrich Curator and  
Ridgefield Guild of Artists Exhibition Director



**Radius** Celebrating the tenth year of Radius, an artist development program co-organized by the Ridgefield Guild of Artists and Aldrich Contemporary Art Museum, two concurrent exhibitions entitled, "Full Circle: Ten Years of Radius"

and "Radius 11" are on view at the Aldrich and the Guild. These exhibitions feature the work of outstanding, contemporary artists from Connecticut and Southeastern New York.

Taking us behind the scenes to get a better grasp of how the works were selected and installed for the "Radius 11" exhibition, Monica Ramirez-Montagut, Curator for the Aldrich, and Debra Browne, Exhibitions Director for the Ridgefield Guild of Artists, will provide a lively conversation about how works of art make the Radius cut for exhibitions in terms of imagery, materials, vision and

process. This talk will take place at the Ridgefield Library on Sunday, February 8 at 2 PM and will be followed by a walk-through of this Radius exhibition at the Guild afterwards, where light refreshments will be served.

The current "Full Circle" exhibition is made up a diverse selection of recent work by exhibiting artists from the first decade of Radius. All of the eighty-one artists who exhibited their work in the first ten *Radius* exhibitions were invited to submit samples of their latest work for review by curator Regine Basha from Arthouse at the Jones Center in Austin, Texas. From these submissions, Basha selected fourteen artists to participate in the exhibition, which is on view at the Aldrich. "Radius 11" is made up of finalists chosen for the most recent annual Radius cycle and is on view at the Guild.
