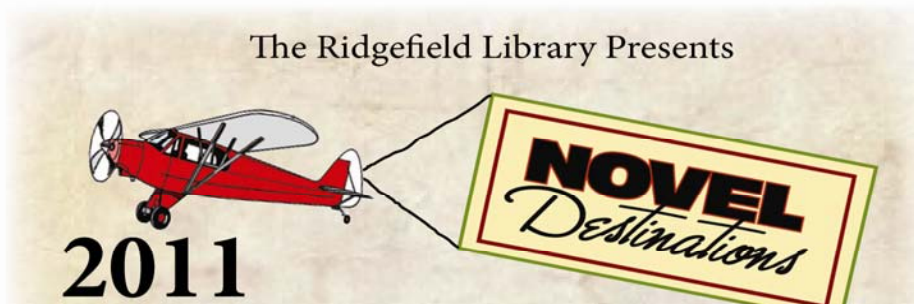

## SUMMER READING FUN FOR ADULTS AT THE RIDGEFIELD LIBRARY

This year's Adult Summer Reading theme is *Novel Destinations!* The program will run during the same time period as the ever popular Children's and Teens' Summer Reading Programs that begin on June 27 and run through August 6. 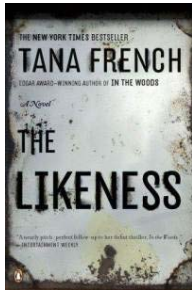
